TO THE PAL COMMUNITY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & CEO



Dear Members and Friends.

The past year has seen Pacific Art League (PAL) strengthen its position as a uniquely welcoming and engaging place in downtown Palo Alto, for people of all ages and backgrounds to come together and enjoy art. From the moment people walk into the building, we want them to feel they are part of a tradition, echoing a time when a small group of Stanford academics and enthusiastic amateur artists, gathered in a club like setting to enjoy and produce art, nearly 100 years ago.

We work hard to honor that tradition but at the same time innovate and bring new ideas to PAL, to keep us relevant and ensure we are a dynamic part of Palo Alto culture. In doing so, over the last 12-months we have added new classes, instructors, and media including improved photography programs, comprehensive after school programs, beginners art instructional classes, along with venturing into artist talks and music, all of which add to the vibrancy of 668 Ramona.

First and foremost, we are an art school, a place to hone skills as artists, but we are also a wonderful gallery space, offering the unique opportunity for our students to enter their work into juried shows. No other art institution in our region offers the chance for a total beginner to attain a level of artistic expression worthy of inclusion in a respected group show environment.

For many years PAL has provided a broad range of classes for adult students and as we evolve and grow we have introduced a more comprehensive kids art program for children of all backgrounds. PAL's after school art program offers a much-needed artistic outlet for local children, while also introducing new families to PAL. In collaboration with Santa Clara County, we have also developed an innovative expressive art program for local underserved and at risk youth.

Additionally, we should never forget that part of our mission is also to serve our faculty of talented instructors, helping them to work and live in this super heated environment, to nurture their skill and the joy they bring to the 2500 students who now join PAL on a yearly basis.

Over the past year we have enhanced the ways we present ourselves to the community through our marketing, the look and feel of the building and with professional staff and experienced gallery management. We have also initiated meaningful relationships with many local arts organizations, to avoid working in a vacuum, but working together to strengthen the visual arts in the region.

Our strong financial success in FY '18 is a true barometer of the demand in our community, people want to take art classes, they want an artistic outlet and to be part of a community. PAL is well placed to satisfy that need, a place for art for all, for the last 97 years and for many years ahead.

Dear Members, Students and Friends of Pacific Art League

Pacific Art League completed another very successful year in which we reached several major milestones. For the first time, education revenue exceeded a half-million dollars, with an increase over the prior year of +37%. Contributed income from the annual gala event, donations and grants exceeded \$160,000.

Our vision is to further enhance our organization as a prestigious and highly professional art center, consistently striving for excellence in all aspects of our operations, mirroring the sophisticated and highly educated level of Palo Alto and surrounding communities.

Under the spirited and competent leadership of our Executive Director and CEO, Jon Graves, we have secured an outstanding team of dedicated, professional and enthusiastic artist instructors, staff, and volunteers.

It is our mission to provide access to the arts for all, including the underprivileged members of our communities, with a special focus on bridging the art gap for youth. As part of that effort we have recently introduced a comprehensive program of after-school art classes on our premises. This new program adds to our existing after school classes we have held for several years in Menlo Park public schools and our teen art classes at 668 Ramona.

In the last year we have also been fortunate in securing several new board members changing our demographic mix and bringing new skills to our team, including professional art experience, corporate management and educational expertise.

Earlier this year we launched a program with Santa Clara County in providing expressive art classes at the Bill Wilson Center for Youth-at-Risk and we expect this well received program to further expand in the coming years.

We are planning to sustain the growth in education and event revenue, while increasing our membership and grants from local foundations. Your continuing support of Pacific Art League is greatly appreciated.

BILL WILSON CENTER - PARTNERSHIP FOR YOUTH AT RISK

In January of 2018, Pacific Art League launched a significant new "Expressive Art" program for youth at risk, partnering with Bill Wilson Centers (BWC) in three locations throughout Santa Clara County.

Between 25-30 young people from high school age and into their early 20's enjoy creative classes and self-expression on a weekly basis, taught by two experienced PAL teachers. We recruited instructors who have expressive art experience and know how to work with at risk youth in a caring and fun way.

PAL gratefully acknowledge the support of Supervisor Joe Simitian and the County of Santa Clara for funding this important program and all of the great staff at BWC for their active support.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

MID-PENINSULA BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB - AFTER SCHOOL ART PROGRAM



Partnering with Mid-Peninsula Boys and Girls Club of San Mateo, PAL launched a much needed, creative after school art classes for 2nd through 5th grade children. On a weekly basis PAL provides a fun, warm and caring experience for 15 students at the John Dore Club House. We are grateful to all our kind donors at the 2018 Gala, for supporting our "Fund a Need" which means hard working parents struggling to hold down two jobs, don't need to pay for this important and nurturing program.

ALT SCHOOL - ART CLASS PARTNERSHIP

We had an extremely positive experience hosting 70 children (Pre-K through 8th grade) from the innovative private ALT School. We built a curriculum and hosted classes in our building over three semesters and had excellent feedback from the school, parents, and students. Sadly, the Alt school closed at the end of our first year of partnering, but we were able to take the lessons learned from this program and the staff involved, to launch our new after school program here in the building, welcoming Art Works Studio of Palo Alto, as part of PAL.



MENLO PARK SCHOOLS - AFTER SCHOOL ART PROGRAM



We continue to provide a dynamic program of after school classes for Encinal, Oak Knoll and Laurel schools in Menlo Park, supported by the PTA groups from each school. Across the three campuses we teach nearly 50 kids on a weekly basis and also offer our unique "Design Thinking" program as one of the classes. We hope to take the experience of offering this innovative STEAM based program into underserved communities in 2019.

CAUSE BASED EXHIBITION "AFRICA THE STRUGGLE OF BEAUTY"

Pacific Art League's "Africa, the Struggle of Beauty" wildlife photography exhibition was the first of a new initiative of annual "Cause Based" exhibitions at PAL. In partnership with WildAid, a prestigious wildlife advocacy organization, this successful show was designed to raise awareness of the loss of wildlife in Africa, by leveraging the power of art to create awareness and promote advocacy to an influential Silicon Valley audience.

This dramatic exhibition featured over 35 works by Emmy Award winning cinematographer and photographer Andy Wegst in both the Main Gallery and Studio One. The exhibition was supported by fine art photography in The Central Gallery by world renowned photographer, Sebastiao Salgado; Black and White Photographer of the Year, Oliver Klink; and local favorites, Igor Pilawski and Teri Vershel.

FIRST FRIDAY ART OPENINGS



Throughout the year, PAL has seen a steady uptick in attendance at First Friday Art Openings. This monthly event is attended by members, artists, families and art enthusiasts from the community. We have strived to include known and respected art professionals as jurors, adding to the prestige of the shows for all our accepted artists. It's always a fun evening out and a great way to start a weekend.

ARTIST TALK - FRED LYON MASTER PHOTOGRAPHER

In the early spring PAL was honored to host veteran master photographer Fred Lyon with the first of our high-profile artists talks. Lyon has been called "San Francisco's Brassaï," and has been compared to Cartier-Bresson, Atget, and Andre Kertesz, but with a San Francisco twist. His nonstop career reaches back to the early 1940s and embraced news, fashion, architecture, advertising, food and his picture credits were everywhere from Life to Vogue and included in many published art books.

With his inimitable charm and wit, this 92-year-old natural story teller ensured we had a memorable experience, surrounded by some of his iconic images of the city he loves so well, San Francisco.



SATURDAY NIGHT MUSIC SERIES



Our unique historic building, with our main gallery nestled on the corner of Ramona and Forrest, is the perfect venue for intimate musical experiences. We experimented with hosting the Palo Alto based The Corina Quartet and the acoustics of the building proved a perfect complement to talented professional musicians.

The Corina Quartet also composed a special interpretation of the great John Barry's iconic theme from "Born Free", to complement our Africa show. There is no better location in the area where people can come and enjoy an evening of both art and music.

ART IN THE WORKPLACE










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
